	RS provided an update concerning Development & Planning:	
	1. Starvehall Farm	
	CBC now investigating drainage issues raised by RS with CBC on the margins of Starvehall Farm developments. CBC to keep RS informed and he will notify PPC of progress.	

2. Pittville School playing field development – proposed development of 58 houses on Pittville School north playing field, bordering PPC. RS advised from Cllr Parsons that CBC Planning Officers in negotiation on the housing development. They are not willing to approve the application as it is currently and are looking for changes. Further meeting to discuss the issues planned imminently. Department of Education will decide on whether to allow or not giving up the land, but this decision and the CBC planning application are independent of each other. CBC must reach decision purely based on planning law.

Decision with Minister. School in discussion with parents looking for more time with minister.

It was pointed out that Land ownership not necessarily required for planning application.

A further dimension to this is that giving up the playing field was directly linked with replacement sports hall requiring hall application and completion.

3. Allotment meeting

CS reported that Rough cut mower was key requirement to support maintenance of allotments, especially when allotments become vacant and before transfer to new tenant. Usage also at Robson field, Village green and Barley Road.

3 quotes presented; £790.00, £809.00 and £852.00 (all inc. VAT)

Proposed Masport Contractor 3N1 mower from Cleeve garden machinery at £809.00 as local provider, existing PPC contract and delivered constructed with warranty.

Seconded IBS.

Unanimously accepted to purchase.

LL and PK both raised concerns about the PPC Strimmer which was currently broken and H&S risk to user. Clerk to progress.

19/7 Reports from Councillors

19/7a

JP reported CBC are strong investors in property in Cheltenham delivering a return on investment.

GCC working with council and University of Gloucestershire (UoG) and other stakeholders to create future vision of Gloucestershire. A wide range of ideas have been produced and a more formal project team has been proposed.

JP. In March Cllr. Roger Whyborn (LD, Up Hatherley) elected Mayor and Cllr. Sandra Holliday (LD, St. Marks) elected Deputy Mayor.

Key issue around local transport is that there has been a Modal

shift to public transport and this requires careful consideration going forward.

Recognition of difficulty of refugee situation and CBC committing to taking 100 refugees over next 4 years.

C5 meeting reported on CBC preparation regarding No deal Brexit contingency planning.

Road naming was often left to developers to decide on road names. It was felt that this should be in consultation with parish councils.

Community pride fund of £30k currently available and could application be made for CCTV – match funding would be required.

CS reported that there is meeting on 2nd May where there will be confirmation of members.

Defibrillator installation and training progressing. Training 19th June evening in the Library. Promotion required through Groups, noticeboards, WI, website and notice in Village store.

19/7e | Website – Update.

PK reported that Netwise have been paid and that information is beginning to be uploaded.

Dummy copy to be circulated for viewing.

One of the key reasons for purchasing the new website was the significance and compliance with the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). Data protection officer needed to maintain and provide oversight of this going forward necessary. Cllr. Harb Singh (HS) was proposed by **PK**, seconded and unanimously agreed. **PK** to inform **HS**.

LL provided update report on Barley Road trees planted by Bloor homes. The hot weather following planting raised concerns about watering new trees. Local community rallied with good involvement.

No water supply on Barley Road. Water bowser and trailer has been donated to provide water supply. Encouraging ownership in community.

Fence planning application submitted and verified.

Solicitors instructed P Smart looking to complete transaction to

transfer land to PPC. The fencing can be completed quickly after acquisition.

Bloor to complete fencing on north side of Barley Road field – TBC.

Care home development- abandoned. It looks like Bloor holding the land as a land bank, potential to be an eye sore. LL to ask Bloor.

JP Excellent work so far.

JP reported feedback from a Seminar regarding travellers on council property – not a problem for borough councils but potentially more difficult for Parish Councils.

Gateways should have height restrictions if wide enough for vehicles.

S106 Money - Update report on playing fields development

LL One quote submitted already for the whole project.

CBC meeting to show initial ideas – positively received but carpark should not be tarmac, prefer sustainable surface. Considerably cheaper than tarmac and easier to maintain and allow a larger area up to 30 cars.

Ideally tarmac for disabled area for ease of access and close to pavilion.

MUGA received positively.

Flood lights ok as long as sufficient distance away from houses (Currently about 50m away). Noted that dormer extended houses are regarded as single stoey for planning applications. Flood lights would provide significant benefit to utilisation of MUGA. Ladies College and Dean Close have had planning application approved with flood lights (15m high lights). Balcarras provides a good example of application information.

Recommended to include full details some items conditional. Recommended full application

Potentially most contentious aspect is the bike park. Although it is away from road and houses. JP noted that noise not considerable compared recent football match.

Current evidence claims bike park reduces antisocial areas and increased footfall helps to reduce antisocial behaviour.

Signage - LL reported the large signs to promote and clarify the purpose of PPC playing fields to be funded by Bloor homes as part of the transfer deed.

LL has been approached by member of rotary club would like to donate 100 trees and this could help to reduce noise. St Mary's school involved in the logo design.
